

Levels:	USDF Introductory through FEI Grand Prix, including Open, Junior/Young Rider, Adult Amateur, as well as Opportunity Classes.

Entries:	Online entries at https://entry.foxvillage.com/ with a credit card.
	Accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis. One entry per horse/rider combination. Completed entries (signature pages, copies of all association cards, and a copy of a current coggins within 12 months of show date (with horse's show name – per USEF rule GR906.4) and a copy of horse's vaccination records within 6 months of show date (per USEF rule GR844)) must to be with entry or be emailed to the competition secretary at dressageshowsec@aol.com or a \$25.00 incomplete entry fee will be charged. All competitors enter the show with this understanding and agreement.
	Email entries to dressageshowsec@aol.com ; emailed entries will only be accepted with a credit card and an \$10 additional fee.
	USEF and USDF non-membership fee(s) are not required for Opportunity Classes.
	Horses are limited to a maximum of three dressage rides per day at Fourth Level and below two dressage rides per day above Fourth Level. Horses competing at both Fourth Level and Prix St. Georges, or their equivalents, are limited to two dressage rides per day. Horses may enter no more than two consecutive levels, Freestyle levels included, at any one competition. Dressage Seat Equitation, Quadrille, Pas de Deux and Materiale classes are excluded from the maximum limit of rides per day and horses in these classes may compete at any level for which they are otherwise eligible during the same competition. See USEF Rule DR119.2.
Payment:	Payment is due at the time entries are submitted to show management in US funds. This competition accepts payment via a credit card on Fox Village Online, and either check or cash at the show. Please contact the show secretary with any questions. Make checks payable to, Fox Lea Farm.
Entry Cancellation and Refunds:	Cancellations only in writing either by e-mail prior to or on the closing date. 100% of entry fees will be refunded with veterinarian or doctor's certificate before the closing date, minus the office fee. NO REFUNDS, including stall and office fees, for any reason after the OFFICIAL PUBLISHED closing date, even if the closing date is extended. Every effort will be made to refund entries via the original method of payment. SEE USEF rule GR910 for substitution of rider.
	All fees collected on behalf of USEF/USDF will be submitted to the Federation provided all outstanding show fees are paid in full, else it will be applied to those removing fees owed to the competition.
Awards:	Divisions (Junior/Young, Adult Amateur, Open) will be run concurrently as one class and pinned separately. Riders must clearly specify their division choice. When no designation is made, riders will automatically be entered as OPEN – exhibitors enter with this understanding and agreement. Riders may enter only one division per class.
	Ribbons to 6th place in all classes/divisions. First Place division winners will receive a prize in addition to a ribbon with 3 or more entries that ride the test.
	High Point Ribbon (Saturday Only):
	A Championship and Reserve Championship ribbon will be awarded for the highest percentage at each USDF/USEF/FEI level. USDF opportunity classes, materiale tests, young horse classes, equitation, and musical freestyles are not eligible for the champion/reserve champion ribbons.
	Ribbons/Awards will not be mailed competitors must pick-up awards before leaving the show.
Pony Measurement:	Please contact the secretary prior to the closing date to set an appointment for a measurement with the show veterinarian and technical delegate. A measurement fee of \$100 must be paid on entry. The measurement must take place prior to first pony test ride.
Sharps Containers:	Sharps containers will be placed in each stabling aisle. Per USEF Rule GR1210.4, Competition Management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. Containers can be found at every wash rack, please notify management if one needs to be attended.
Non-competing horses:	\$100 for the weekend – for horses not competing in the show. Must fill out entry form for number and pay office fee, along with stabling. No USEF/USDF fees need to be paid. Coggins and vaccination are
Confirmation of Entry:	required with entry for non-competing horses. Confirmation of entry will be e-mailed to the rider. All e-mail addresses must be clearly indicated. Make sure you turn off your spam filter for Fox Village.

Definitions:	Adult Amateur (AA) = Individuals possessing current amateur certification are only eligible as Adult Amateurs from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22. USEF rule DR119.3. Only active United States Equestrian Federation members may obtain amateur status. (Exception: Equine Canada members in possession of current EC membership may sign for USEF Amateur status on a show-by-show basis at no cost). Participants must possess current USEF Amateur status and qualify under the USEF Amateur rules. If opportunity classes at Dressage Competitions are restricted to amateurs, riders are required to have an amateur status with USEF. Junior/Young Rider (JR/YR) = Open to Junior & Young Riders only. Individuals are eligible as JR's until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Individuals are eligible as YR's from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age 21. See USEF rule DR119.3.			
Late Entries:	\$50 – if postmarked and received after the closing/received by date.			
Post Class Entries:	\$10 plus normal class fee – Post class entries accepted ONLY if time allows.			
Returned Check or	\$50 for checks/declined credit cards returned due to non-negotiable funds.

Great American/ USDF Qualifying Classes:	Please indicate that the class is to count for qualifying by placing a Q after the class number. Qualifying will not require a separate ride. An exhibitor riding in the Open, Adult Amateur or Junior/Young rider classes will pay an additional \$20 USDF qualifying fee (must be paid prior to start of the class) to have the score entered in the Great American/USDF qualifying division at that level. Qualifying classes count towards the 2025 Great American/USDF Regional Championships. Check the www.usdf.org for qualifying dates, score requirements and locations of championships.			
No Shows:	All "No Shows" that have not contacted the show office, prior to their first ride, will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show and time slots may be filled. Exhibitors enter with this understanding and agreement.			
Ride Times:	Unofficial ride times will be posted to www.foxvillage.com after 6:00 PM on Tuesday, December 3rd. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform show management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the unofficial ride times. Please DO NOT call for your ride times. Official ride times will be posted in the show office by NOON the day before the competition starts. In addition, ride times and show updates will be posted on www.foxleafarm.com .			
Arenas/Footing:	All competition arenas will be in 20mx60m arenas. In case of overfill, show management may elect to run some classes in a 20mx40m arena. All rings and warm-up areas are sand/poly-fiber mixture. Lunging footing is the same as all competition and schooling arenas; lunging only in designated areas.

Opportunity Classes:	Open to those new to showing dressage. Horses and riders competing in "opportunity" classes are exempt from USEF and USDF membership requirements, and do not have to pay non-member or horse identification number (HID) fees or USEF drug fees. "Opportunity" riders/horses will be allowed to cross-enter other recognized classes at the show but must pay all applicable USEF and USDF fees. Opportunity classes follow all USEF Dressage Division rules and applicable USEF general rules, including dressage and saddlery, and are subject to drug testing. Opportunity classes cannot be used as qualifying classes for the Great American/USDF Regional Championships.	
Stabling:	254 Permanent box stalls with doors are 10' x 10' or 12' x 12' and are available on a first come, first served basis by entries received by date. Stabling requests honored when possible. Stall bedding is not included. Shavings are available for purchase at \$10.95 per bag and order can be included with entry. You may bring your own shavings or purchase bags through the show office – please do not use straw or pellets for bedding, wood shavings only. To do so, please indicate the number of bags you wish to receive on your entry form. The bags you order will be outside your stall when you arrive.	
	Owners and exhibitors shall be held responsible for damage caused by them, their agents, or employees to stalls, buildings and other properties on the show grounds, and shall be billed accordingly. Stall changes must be approved by the show office. Horses found in an incorrect stall may be moved and fined \$50.00. This is for safety issues. Stallion owners need to bring suitable equipment to close off the stall, if necessary, for the safety of your horse and those stabled near him.	
	Stalls will be available after 12 PM on FRIDAY thru Sunday (two hours after the last class of the day). No arrivals after 9:00 PM on Friday, unless show management is notified. Early arrivals and late departures must be approved by show management and may be assessed additional stabling fees.	
	Please list stable groups on the entry form and use only one name for each stable group to ensure that your group will be stabled together.	
	SMOKING IS PROHIBITED IN STALL AREAS.	
Weather/Acts of God/Accidents or Emergency Policy:	Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, acts of God, accidents or emergencies. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to any Championship or qualifying classes being offered. No refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, acts of God, accidents, or emergencies. See GR.311.	
	During inclement weather, for safety and social distancing, participants will be asked to shelter in their personal vehicles or in their tack stall. Participants will not be allowed to congregate in the concession stand or the show office.	
Camper/RV Hook-up:	\$90 per night – Camping/RV Hook-up will be assigned on a "first come, first serve" based upon receipt of entry. Available after 12PM on Friday through Sunday at 7PM. 30 or 50 AMP electricity is available. NO electric or water hookups permitted from barns.	
Medical:	Medical personnel will be on grounds. Ambulance on call.	
Farrier (on call):	On call, see information at the show office.

Food:	Will be available on the show grounds during normal show hours.	
Warning:	Under the Equine Activity Liability Act, each participant who participates in an equine activity expressly assumes the risks of engaging in and legal responsibility for injury, loss, or damage to person or property resulting from the risk of equine activities.	
Other:	Per USEF rule (GR1301.6): Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash (not to exceed 6 feet in length) or otherwise contained (in a tack stall/cage etc.). Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalties by USEF, as well as warning cards. Loose animals or animal's left in vehicles in distress, etc., can and will be removed, from the grounds at the owner's expense.

	Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such

Prize Giving/Award	Per USEF Rule DR123.13, "Participation in prize-giving (awards) ceremonies by placed rider/horse
Ceremonies:	combinations may be mandatory and failure to participate may result in loss of prizes and prize money
	at the discretion of Competition Management. Specific requirements and penalties for failure to
	participate in prize-giving ceremonies must be announced in the prize list." This show does NOT require
	a prize giving/awards ceremony; therefore, it is not mandatory for placed riders to attend.
	Awards/ribbons will be given to competitors at the end of each class, and as such, they can be picked up
	in the show office.
Freestyle Entries:	Per USEF Rule DR129.9: Except for USEF/USDF Championship classes and for FEI Pony Riders, FEI Junior
	and FEI Young Rider Freestyles, in order to enter a freestyle class at any level, a horse/rider combination
	must have received a minimum score of 63% for Training through Fourth levels and 60% for FEI levels in
	the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level at a Federation /USDF
	Licensed Dressage Competition or FEI recognized Dressage Competition or "open" Dressage class (i.e.
	open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the
	horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. To enter an FEI Para Dressage Freestyle
	class, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 60% in any FEI Para Dressage
	test (Para Novice Test, Para Intermediate Test or Para Grand Prix Test) at the rider's classified Grade.
	This score may be earned at a USEF/USDF licensed Dressage Competition or FEI recognized Dressage
	Competition or "open" Dressage class (i.e. open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held
	prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. A
	photocopy of the test verifying eligibility, or copy of the USDF score verification, must be submitted with
	the entry for a freestyle class. All FEI Pony Rider Tests are equivalent to Second Level; all FEI Junior Tests are equivalent to Third Level; all FEI Young Rider Tests are equivalent to PSG; and the USEF Brentina Cup

Bridle Numbers must be worn at all times when a horse is out their stall either being exercised or ridden.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES AND MINORS USEF Rule GR901.29/GR1301.7/GR1301.8: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

WARNING: Under the Equine Activity Liability Act, each participant who participates in an equine activity expressly assumes the risks of engaging in and legal responsibility for injury, loss, or damage to person or property resulting from the risk of equine activities. Please be aware of the laws specific to the show location.

Show Management reserves the right to vary or add officials and refuse any entry for a cause; to disqualify any exhibitor and/or his or her horse for cause; to cause an exhibitor to forfeit his or her ribbons and winnings for cause; to return any entry and/or stall fee before or during the show for cause; all without being liable for damage or compensation. Show management reserves the right to make any changes deemed necessary for the safe and efficient conduct of this competition.

Important Notice to all affected parties: Third parties may come upon the property or enter the facilities where any herein described or listed event will occur; provided, that this is a license to enter the premises, for the purpose of observing or participating in the event, but not otherwise, and such license to any individual is subject to revocation by the owner, lessee or organizer, and entry for any purpose other than granted herein, shall be deemed criminal trespass and subject to appropriate legal proceedings.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not count towards national awards. The proof of these numbers must be in the form of either their actual membership/registration cards or a facsimile of them. Proof of membership must be included with the entry form. Please provide the USEF/USDF Master Verification (www.eqverification.org) although membership cards or photocopies of cards are still acceptable. Failure to provide proof of USEF and/or USDF membership will result in competitor being charged non-member fees. Members that are unable to produce the USDF memberships cards/registrations or a facsimile will be asked to sign an affidavit and pay an affidavit fee. All entries are taken on a first come, first served basis. Some shows return late arriving entries after the show is filled, and some shows place entries on a wait list on an as-received basis. Please check each show for any additional policies. Send in the entries as soon as possible to assure entry to the show. Only one horse-rider combination, per entry form, per show.



USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of individual members and over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

The USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program recognizes adult amateurs competing in equitation and promotes correct seat, position, and use of the aids in dressage. An Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class presented by Big Dee's Tack and Vet Supply will be held in conjunction with each of the nine USDF Regional Dressage Championship competitions, providing adult amateurs with additional opportunity for recognition. Ribbons awarded through 8th Place and gift certificates awarded to top four riders.

Adult amateurs wishing to qualify to compete in an Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final may do so by meeting the following requirements.

Qualifying Requirements

To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have

- Earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Dressage competition within the qualifying period of the applicable regional championship.
- b) Qualified to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles).

Membership Requirements

- Rider must have a USDF Participating Membership at the time the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Rider must be an adult amateur, in accordance with GR1306 of the USEF rules, and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur when the score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.

2025 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2025 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s).
 A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.
- Horses must be entered in qualifying and championship classes under their official recorded names and ownership as
 specified in USEF GR1102.3, and transfers of ownership or lease registrations must be completed in compliance with USEF
 rules GR1105 and GR1108 prior to the competition in order for the horse to compete under the name of the new owner or
 lessee. (USEF DR127.2)

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual or Life Recorded Farm/Business). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF.
 For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.
- * PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. The minimum percentages are as follows:

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions:

Owners and riders, including foreign riders

and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those
 sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at
 Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are
 exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot,
 academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM
 identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$100), 5-years (\$400), or life (\$2,000). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$80). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$280) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$55 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$45). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$95. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$140) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.



USEF Equine Vaccination Rule

From the USEF Communications Department

Lexington, Ky. - In January, the USEF Board of Directors approved an addition to the rule book, which outlines equine vaccination requirements at licensed competitions. Beginning December 1, 2015, all horses entering the grounds of a Federation-licensed competition must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables.

Due to several high profile Equine Herpes (EHV) outbreaks in recent years that have involved the neuropathic strain of the virus (equine herpesvirus myeloencephalopathy-EHM), some competitions have placed vaccination requirements on their competitors that go beyond most accepted medical opinions and raise concern that unnecessary requirements can potentially put a horse at risk. The intent of this rule is to ensure that all licensed competitions comply with the vaccination guidelines for Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes (Rhinopneumonitis) published by the American Association of Equine Practitioners (AAEP). These guidelines are reviewed by infectious disease experts regularly, and recommend vaccinating competition horses at six-month intervals for both equine influenza (flu) and rhinopneumonitis (EHV-1 and EHV-4). There is not a vaccine that protects against EHM.

Intended to promote proper vaccination protocols, this rule does not anticipate an increased workload for competition management. The flu vaccination information can be added to the documentation already required by most competitions: a horse's health certificate and a negative coggins test.

WARNING:

Under Florida law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities.

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the USEF Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any USEF Events.
